#### LETTER FROM 2017-2018 CHAIR

July 12, 2018

Students in Alabama have many options when they decide to pursue higher education. It is no longer the case that they only need to decide their major and which university or college to attend. Many times their path starts at one of Alabama's 22 community colleges and continues at one of the state's 14 public universities. The Articulation and General Studies Committee (AGSC) was established nearly 25 years ago to facilitate such transfer and to eliminate the loss of time, credit, and money for our students.

Today, transfer has become even more prevalent than imagined 25 years ago: Students begin at a 4-year institution, take classes during the summer at their local community college, and then continues at a different university, Occasionally, university students or graduates transfer to a 2-year college to get a degree or certificate that offers them high-paying job prospects. Of course, we have also seen booming dual enrollment programs. In all cases, students are consumers who look for value and expect to receive credit for the work they have done.

Fortunately, the Statewide Transfer and Articulation Reporting System (STARS), which is managed by professional staff members and overseen by the AGSC, has remained flexible and facilitates all kinds of transfer. The Committee is now seeking to enhance the user-friendliness of STARS through developing a more mobile friendly platform. We will also host our first ever Transfer and Student Success Conference, March 6 – 7, 2019.

In a recent development, the State of Alabama's higher education community has become a member of the national movement, "Complete College America" (CCA). The aim of CCA is to develop collaboration among colleges and universities that will enable the State to increase the number and percentage of persons holding postsecondary degrees. Additionally, our State is engaged in an effort to increase the attainment of certificates and degrees to meet workforce demands of current and anticipated jobs and careers. The outcomes achieved through our AGSCSTARS articulation and general studies program are significant contributors to both of these efforts.

There is an intangible benefit of the AGSC in that it provides one of the few ways for administrators from 2-year and 4-year colleges and universities to get together regularly, get to know each other, and work to achieve a common goal. I truly cherish this opportunity and appreciate having gotten to know my valued colleagues on the committee.

### AGSC/STARS Accomplishments Based on 2017-18 Priorities A STATUS REPORT

#### 1. Make STARS Guides more accessible on mobile platforms.

While the current STARS website is useable on desktop and mobile devices, it has been determined that the STARS staff will need to contract with an outside company to accomplish this task. The current site has over 500 html pages and hundreds more pdf files. In addition, the current STARS site runs a robust database that produces the transfer guides used by students across the state. This database must work with the new coding / updated site.

This is a major undertaking.

The STARS Staff was instructed by the AGSC Strategic Planning Sub-Committee to obtain quotes from at least two outside companies to see what they might charge to redesign and re-vamp the STARS website so that it works better on mobile devices. The following companies were contacted obtain more information and quotes:

- In10sity

Much work still needs to be done to accomplish this task. This will be an on-going priority moving forward into 2019.

2. Establish a Planning Committee to develop a statewide conference on transfer and student success to be sponsored by the AGSC in 2018-2019.

The conference planning committee has established the groundwork for a state-wide Transfer Student Success Conference to be hosted on the campus of Lawson State Community College in the spring of 2019 (March 6-7). The conference will be free and will cover a variety of topics that directly impact the success of transfer students in Alabama. We are tentatively scheduled to have two key-note speakers and at least two break-out sessions with various topics for the attendees to choose from. A webpage has been created on the STARS website to provide information about the conference. For more info visit the following website: http://www.gettheguide.net/achieve2019.html. To make this a success, it will need to continue to be a top priority through March of 2019.

 Initiate an annual STARS training session for Institutional Points of Contact in conjunction with the Fall AGSC meeting and consider offering a webinar or other distance delivered sessions for Points of Contact each spring.

On October 12, 2017, all of the AGSC/STARS Institutional Points of Contact were invited to attend a STARS Training Session in conjunction with the Fall AGSC meeting. A grand total of 41 Points of Contact attended this fall meeting. All of the four-year universities sent at least one person to the training. All but six of the two-year colleges were represented sent representatives.

In addition, the Executive Director has continued to meet with various Points of Contact since the fall meeting. Some of these training sessions have been conducted on campuses while other have taken place via teleconference or web-conference.

4. Establish a task force to evaluate and revise as needed the current structure of the General Studies Academic Committees and Pre-Professional Academic Committees and make recommendations for improvement by Spring 2018.

Throughout 2018, much thought has gone into how the AGSC can improve the structure of the various academic committees in order to make them more efficient and effective. Currently there are 21 General Studies Academic Committees (GSACs) - comprised of 367 faculty members. In addition, there are 16 Preprofessional Academic Committees (PACs) comprised of more than 173 faculty members.

This summer, a proposal will be made that calls for the reduction of the GSAC committees from 21 down to 3 "AREA Committees" (AREA I&II, AREA III, and AREA IV). The 17 PACs will not change.

## AGSC/STARS Accomplishments Based on 2017-18 Priorities A STATUS REPORT (Continued)

The newly proposed AREA Committees would each be made up of ten members (5 from four-year members and 5 two-year members). These committees would still review and recommend courses for approval in their AREA. They would also review and suggest changes to templates that fall under disciplines within their area. The Council of Chief Academic Officers would name the four-year members for each area and the Chancellor of the Alabama College System would name the two-year members. All members would serve on staggered three year terms.


This is currently just a proposal. It has not yet been discussed and/or approved by the AGSC.

#### 5. Implement a standardized template for institutional Area V pages by Spring 2018.

In October of 2017, the AGSC Area V Subcommittee sent out a memorandum (along with a suggested template) to all of the four-year points of contact and requested that they work with their institutions to update their Area V pages for each of their majors to reflect the layout of the template provided. They were given a deadline of June 1, 2018 to complete this project. In April of 2018, the Executive Director sent out another reminder (printed and mailed) to the four-year points of contact. Finally in early June of 2018, the Executive Director sent out a survey to the points of contact to gauge their progress. The chart to the right provides a status report of for each of the four-year institutions work.

#### PROGRESS UPDATE

Three of the institutions have met the original deadline. Two are 75% complete. Another two are 50% complete. Another three are 25% complete. The other four institutions have not responded and are, according to our records, 0% complete. We will continue to work with all the institutions to complete this improvement process. Another attempt to encourage this updating process will be a top priority in 2018-2019.



#### STARS OFFICE UPDATE

#### Staffing

In 2016-2017, all four student workers positions were eliminated from the STARS staff. This leaves the STARS Office with the following three staff members:

- Keith Sessions, Executive Director (full-time)
- Shannon Nichols, IT Director and Programmer (full-time)
- Anita Brown, Executive Secretary (part-time)

These three staff members have over 79 years of total experience working on the AGSC/STARS Program.

#### Computers and Software

The desktops used by the staff are less than 3 years old. The server used to generate the STARS Transfer Guides is approximately 4 years old. These machines will likely need to be replace in the next few years. We uses PROGRESS 4GL Software to run the STARS Database to generate all transfer guides. At this time the software is up-to-date.

#### Marketing and Promotion

We continue to look for inexpensive but effective ways to market and promote the STARS program throughout the state using printed materials (brochures, bookmarks, and post cards), online resources, and face-to-face contact.

We are constantly sending out marketing materials to twoyear colleges, four-year universities, and high-school advising offices. The majority of the two-year colleges do an excellent job of assisting us in the marketing and promoting the program to their students.

#### **STARS Training and Campus Visits**

The staff continued its effort to visit all areas of the state in order to provide opportunities for STARS training/updates. A list of campus visits and presentations is provided on page 8 of this report.



#### DID YOU KNOW?

- The STARS Office maintains over **163 different program templates** (these templates become the transfer guides that protect thousands of transfer students each year).
- The STARS Office maintains over **1,700 courses** in the course database. Of those, **1,348 courses have** been approved for statewide transfer by the AGSC. (The STARS Office works to keep current syllabi for each approved course on file and makes them available through the STARS website).
- The STARS Office works with approximately 540 two-year and four-year faculty members who volunteer to serve on more than 37 separate discipline committees.
- The STARS Office works directly with over **90 two-year and four-year points of contact** to maintain STARS and implement AGSC policy throughout the state.
- The STARS Office maintains over **500 html web pages** on the official STARS website. In addition there are hundreds of pdf documents accessible through the website. All coordination and maintenance of the STARS Website is accomplished by a full-time **staff of two**.
- If you add up all the years of service by the current STARS staff, you have over **79 years of experience** working with the state articulation program.
- Since 2007, the amount of money that the STARS Transfer Guide System has saved students and their parents is conservatively estimated to be **OVER ONE BILLION DOLLARS**. (See next page)



#### DID YOU KNOW? (Continued)



Since 2007, the amount of money that the STARS Transfer Guide System has SAVED students and their parents (by simply preventing them from taking a course at a two-year college that would not transfer and then having to retake a course at their four-year institution to make up for the lost credit hours) is conservatively estimated to be **OVER ONE BILLION DOLLARS**.

**NOTE:** This estimate only includes the average cost of tuition and books. It does not include other expenses related to attending college (i.e., cost of living, additional student fees, and loss of job opportunities due to delay in graduation.)



This chart represents usage by two-year college students since the fall of 1998.





This chart represents usage by two-year during the 2017-2018 academic year distributed by month.




#### ANNUAL STARS TWO-YEAR STUDENT USAGE REPORT BY MAJOR




Transfer Institution Choices by Two-Year Students for July 2017 - June 2018

#### 2018-2019 AGSC/STARS Priorities and Goals

- 1. Continue to investigate methods and processes that can be used to improve the AGSC/STARS website so that it works well on most mobile devices/platforms. If necessary, STARS can contract out various parts of this project where expertise is needed.
- 2. Finalize plans for 1st Annual AGSC/STARS Transfer Student Success Conference and begin to publicize and promote this event across the state. Hold the conference on March 6-7, 2019 on the campus of Lawson State Community College. After the conference review and assess the success of the conference and begin to plan for future conferences.
- 3. Continue to meet (at least once annually) with the Points of Contact to provide on-going training and updates regarding AGSC/STARS issues.
- 4. Begin the process to convert the existing 21 General Studies Academic Committees to 3 AREA Committees. The STARS staff should meet with these new committees at least once annually (more if needed) to review and update approved courses/ratified templates and address any other transfer issues relating to their academic area.
- 5. Create various AGSC/STARS training videos (made available through the website) that can be used by academic administrators and other staff members across the state to train and inform end-users and faculty about the AGSC/STARS Program.
- 6. Work with AREA III Committee to review current math course offerings in AREA III and determine if there are changes/additions that need to be made in terms of adding a Quantitative Reasoning or Quantitative Statistics course (MTH 265).
- 7. Continue to move toward completion of the AREA V template revision by all four-year institutions.
