Courses suggested for inclusion in AREA II as a language:

ASL 101 - AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE I

This course is an introduction to American Sign Language. Students will learn the basis of nonverbal communication skills as a foundation for learning American Sign Language. Upon course completion, students should be able to introduce themselves, exchange personal information, talk about one's family activities, give directions, and describe others utilizing sign language. (3 SH - 2 Theory/1Lab)

ASL 102 - AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE 2

ASL 101 is pre-req to ASL 102. This course is part two of a five part sequence and allows students the opportunity to practice sign language skills. In addition, the course provides students with instruction on how to make requests, talk about family, occupation, and daily routines in sign language. Upon course completion, students should be able to conduct a basic conversation utilizing sign language. (3 SH - 2 Theory/1Lab)

AGSC PROCEDURE TO HAVE THESE COURSES APPROVED FOR AREA II:

- 1) Alabama Transfers staff sends course proposals with representative syllabi to AREA II Academic Committee for review/ vote
- 2) AREA II Academic Committee must have 15 yes votes for courses to be recommended to AGSC for final approval
- 3) Courses then come to AGSC for vote (8 of 10 members must vote yes for course to be approved)
- 4) Alabama Transfers staff then places courses on all transfer guides where appropriate in AREA II
- 5) Alabama Transfer staff notifies all institutions of these newly approved courses that they must accept
