directory/course-directory-listing/. The computer sciences courses are listed under the "Section 2 Career & Technical". It is hard to know which community colleges offer the courses and which do not. The larger community colleges like Calhoun and Jeff State will most likely offer most of the courses, but the smaller more rural community colleges may not.

I have recently worked with UAH on the Cyber Security/Operations Technology guide (view it @ https://alabamatransfers.com/official-guide/demo?major=cyber-security). There were several CIS courses that I added to our database in Area V that had not previously been used on any of our guides. From what I understand, you all don't directly offer all of them and will depend on students transferring in with them (correct me if I am wrong). If this is the case, what you can do, is add a note to your Area V page for these programs and to let students know that if they don't transfer in with them, they may need to take transient courses at Calhoun after they transfer to UAH (this would be in cases where students are coming from a smaller community college that may not offer the CIS courses).

The template ratification form process was a bit confusing to me (I wasn't sure what it was for at first!) But I think I have gotten it. I do have a question before I finalize it. I used the list of classes from the Alabama transfers list online, but there are some courses that could go in the first two years that did not have an equivalent listed on their website. However, some specific schools had classes that matched; for example, Jeff State and Calhoun have a course called CIS 202 Python Programming, which is comparable to CS 104: Intro to CS using Python, a course required for the BS in Game Design degree.

Is there a comprehensive listing of community college possible courses available somewhere, so I can look for equivalents that are offered at all community colleges? Should I list classes with our course numbers, which might be taught at some of the community colleges?
