AREA I – Written Composition (6 Semester Hours)

Effective written communication skills are essential in a literate society. Minimum requirements include at least 6 semester hours in written composition. **(NOTE: English Composition I and II are the only courses available in AREA I.)**

AREA II – Humanities and Fine Arts (12 Semester Hours)

Study in the humanities addresses the ability to deal with questions of values, ethics, or aesthetics as they are represented in literature, philosophy, religion, and the arts, and is fundamental to general education. Minimum requirements include at least 12 semester hours in humanities with a minimum 3 semester hours in literature*, 3 semester hours in the arts, and the remaining semester hours from the humanities and/or fine arts. In addition to literature, disciplines in the humanities include, but are not limited to, philosophy, religious studies, speech, foreign languages, art, music, theatre, and dance.

*NOTE: Students must complete a 6-semester-hour sequence either in literature or in history in Area II or IV.


AREA III – Natural and Mathematical Sciences (11-12 Semester Hours)

Study in the natural and mathematical sciences emphasizes the scientific method and applies quantitative or inductive reasoning. Minimum requirements include at least 11 semester hours with at least 3 semester hours in mathematical sciences** and at least 8 semester hours in the natural sciences which must include laboratory experiences. Disciplines in the mathematical sciences include mathematics and statistics and courses should be broad in scope and content. Disciplines in the natural sciences include but are not limited to, astronomy, biology, chemistry, geology, and physics.

**NOTE: Some mathematics courses are offered for 4 semester credit hours. This would account for the variation in hour requirements in Area III.


AREA IV – History, Social, and Behavioral Sciences (12 Semester Hours)

Study in history and the social and behavioral sciences deals primarily with the study of human behavior, social and political structures, and economics. Minimum requirements include 12 semester hours with at least 3 semester hours in history* and at least 6 semester hours from among other disciplines in the social and behavioral sciences. Disciplines include, but are not limited to, anthropology, economics, geography, political science, psychology, and sociology.

*NOTE: Students must complete a 6-semester-hour sequence either in literature or in history in Area II or IV.

The guide is the most important document. To explain the difference in the two, it goes back to the process of how we created guides in the past. The template is a document that the university would create and submit to us in order get new guides approved for students. It is what I like to call the skeleton of the guide. I use it to build the guide. In recent years, I have been building both the template and guides to save work on your end (using my best guess on the requirements from what I find on the university website). We use both in order to get the program approved by the Alabama General Studies Committee (AGSC), but the students will only ever see and use the guide once it is approved.

That being said, I have corrected the language in Area IV to match the guide. After looking at the guide and template closer, I may have missed a note in Area II dealing with the Literature and History sequence. Students are able to choose either a literature or history sequence (it is baked into the template) unless you need a specific sequence at UAH. The note on the guide in Area II was missing. I have added that note. So, with the notes there, students could chose to take a history sequence or take the minimum 3 SH of history in Area IV. Then, they would have to complete anywhere from 6-9 SH from the 10 courses depending on how many hours of history they chose. If this needs to be corrected, please let me know.

I have attached updated copies of the template and guide. Please let me know if there is anything else that needs correcting. If everything looks correct, also let me know. Once we have your approval, we will add this to the AGSC agenda for the next meeting to get it approved.
