I. ART 100 Art Appreciation – 3 Semester Hours

II. Course Description

This course is an introduction to the appreciation of art through an examination of the themes and purposes of art, the exploration of visual arts media and methods, and culturally significant works of art from the past and present. The course informs students about the language of art and its relevance in everyday life.

V. Course Objectives

By the end of the course, students will be able to

- 1. apply the elements of art and principles of design to critically analyze works of art;
- 2. evaluate the relationships and themes in art, history, culture and society;
- 3. demonstrate the ability to communicate using relevant art vocabulary;
- 4. demonstrate an understanding of various art media, techniques, and creative processes;
- 5. use critical thinking to evaluate art and interpret the world around them;
- 6. evaluate the influence of art in a global and contemporary context; and
- 7. evaluate and articulate connections between visual arts and other disciplines.

VII. Evaluation and Assessment

Grades will be given based upon A = 90 - 100%, B = 80 - 89%, C = 70 - 79%, D = 60 - 69%, and F = below 60%.

VIII. Attendance
